

The Season after Pentecost

Our current liturgical season, the Season after Pentecost, is by far the longest of the Episcopal Church. year. It begins the day after Pentecost and ends the day before the First Sunday of Advent. Since the date of Easter changes every year—and the Day of Pentecost is always 50 days after Easter—the length of the season varies as well, ranging from 24–29 weeks in length. This season is sometimes called Ordinary Time, a phrase borrowed from the Roman Catholic Church.

A common practice among Episcopal churches is to change the appropriate liturgical elements at the start of each new season. Often these changes are directed by the Book of Common Prayer, such as the acclamations named for use in the Lenten and Easter seasons. However, liturgical leaders also decide which Prayers of the People, Eucharistic Prayer, blessing, and dismissal are used in services.

BISHOP'S MESSAGE

Pray for the Peace of Jerusalem

May they prosper who love you. Peace be within your walls and quietness within your towers.

Psalm 122:6-7 NRSV

The news this past week from Israel and Gaza has been devastating. The war between Israel and Hamas has killed thousands and displaced almost half a million people. It is a humanitarian disaster and there is untold suffering and need in Gaza and in Israel. Yesterday, at least 400 lives were lost in a missile strike at the Ahli Arab Hospital in Gaza, including children, refugees, and medical personnel.

I have visited the Ahli Arab Hospital. It is a ministry of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem, the only Christian hospital in Gaza, and the only place where people of all faiths could receive treatment regardless of income or ability to pay. Ahli Arab Hospital offered cancer treatments that residents of Gaza could not access anywhere else, and in general was a force for good and an embodiment of the Gospel in a community in tremendous need.

The bombing of the Ahli Arab Hospital is a devastating blow to the displaced people of Gaza. Both Palestinian and Israeli communities are suffering and there is grief, loss, fear, and pain in all communities in the region. At this time, I ask your prayers for all those afflicted by this terrible war, for an end to the violence, for healing for all who suffer, and for comfort and consolation for those who mourn. I invite you also to join me in supporting relief work through the efforts of the <u>American Friends of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem</u>.

I trust the American Friends of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem to do good with any funds that are raised. The Episcopal Archbishop of Jerusalem has been a friend of mine and Clarke's for many years, and the situation is truly devastating. The human need is overwhelming. Thank you for your prayers and support.

We have all been invited in the last few days to join with Archbishop Hosam Naoum and the Patriarchs and Heads of Churches in Jerusalem, as well as Pope Francis and Archbishop Justin Welby, to pray fervently for all those who have been hurt, harmed, or killed in this conflict.

My heart aches when I remember visiting al-Ahli hospital in 2018 during Holy Week to meet the medical teams and all the

people of that remarkable ministry. They were passionately committed to anyone who had need.

I know personally how faithful Episcopalians are in praying. During my surgery and recovery, you have prayed for me and for my healing, and I am more grateful and thankful than words can say.

Right now, I ask you to pray fervently for the birthplace of the Abrahamic faiths and for all its people. Pray for those who have been hurt, harmed, or killed—regardless of who they are or who did it.

Pray also for the leaders and people of the entire region, that they will remember God's mercy, and that they will find the way to a just peace where all may live in safety and security as God intends.

Pray this week for President Biden, that he may be an advocate for immediate humanitarian access for those who desperately need food, water, and medicine—and for comfort and consolation for those who have been displaced and those who are grieving loved ones.

Please join me in praying:

Eternal God, in whose perfect kingdom no sword is drawn but the sword of righteousness, no strength known but the strength of love: So mightily spread abroad your Spirit, that all peoples may be gathered under the banner of the Prince of Peace, as children of one Father; to whom be dominion and glory, now and forever.
